*Mission Moment: Father Moreau was declared to be a Servant of God worthy of the title Venerable on April 12, 2003, by Pope John Paul II. The Decree on his virtue released by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints and signed by Joseph Cardinal Saraiva Martins, Prefect, stated that:

"Basil Anthony Mary Moreau, without relying on human means, placed his trust in God and found in Him the necessary strength to overcome the many serious difficulties and insults he faced. In the aftermath of the French Revolution, he strongly resolved to effectively renew the Church through parish missions, the Christian education of youth and various works of charity."

The decree went on to state that Moreau founded the religious family of Holy Cross including men and women in order to provide stability and continuation of this important work. The Decree continued saying that after the complete report to John Paul II by the Cardinal Prefect, the Pope approved it and ordered the proclamation of the Decree on the heroic virtues of Basil Anthony Mary Moreau:

"We declare that Father Basil Anthony Mary Moreau, Priest Founder of the men and women religious of the Congregation of Holy Cross, practiced the theological virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity towards God and neighbor, as well as the cardinal virtues of Prudence, Justice, Temperance and Fortitude annexed to them to an heroic degree."

Father Moreau's cause was first introduced by the Bishop of Le Mans beginning in 1947 although the first decree regarding its introduction is dated in 1955. The nearly 50 year process involved numerous steps and required much work on the part of many people. Since the Decree in 2003, several possible miracles attributable to Moreau were examined until the miracle involving a twenty-eight year old Canadian named Mrs. Laurette Comtois in June of 1948 was presented to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints on January 21, 2005, as evidence to support Father Moreau's beatification in September of 2007.
